The [Center for Forest Nursery and Seedling Research](#) at the [University of Idaho](#) is seeking two undergraduate students with interest in regeneration of native plants, including commercial forest tree species, or nursery management for its summer internship program.

Advanced undergraduate students with interest in nursery management, forest regeneration, riparian restoration, and/or early stand silviculture will find this an excellent opportunity to develop research and technical skills. These positions will involve both performing tasks associated with an operational nursery and assisting with ongoing nursery and field research projects.

The [Department of Forest Resources](#) operates the state-of-the-art [Franklin H. Pitkin Nursery](#) at the University of Idaho, which grows more than 500,000 seedlings per year. Research conducted at the nursery benefits seedling growers and users by focusing on seedling quality and all facets of nursery stock production.

Interns will work 20 hrs/wk as a grower-trainee and 20 hrs/wk as a research technician, and be active members of a research and operational team. This is a paid internship, with salary negotiable based on qualifications. The position will be filled from early May through the middle of August 2007. Applicants will be evaluated on their resume, transcripts, references and an interview. Applications are due 23 March 2007.
